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Security Overview

Our technology stack is secured using a multi-layered approach that leverages Microsoft Identity, Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA), and robust token-based authentication mechanisms. Below are the key components of our security infrastructure:

1. Microsoft Identity and MFA (TOTP)

- We utilize Microsoft Identity for user authentication, ensuring secure access to our applications.
- Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) is implemented using Time-based One-Time Password (TOTP) to add an extra layer of security. Users can verify their identity through the Microsoft Authenticator app, reducing the risk of unauthorised access.

2. Token Authentication Layer

- When making calls to the Optomate.Net database, we employ a token authentication layer that generates a new token for every call and has a lifespan of 3 minutes.
- This ensures tokens are short-lived and reduces the window of opportunity for their misuse.

3. Private Network Hosting

- The application and database are hosted within an Azure virtual private network.
- This setup uses data isolation services to protect your data from malicious access, ensuring that only authorised entities can access the network.

4. Data Hosting and Backup

- Databases are hosted on Australian servers, complying with local data residency requirements.
- We use the Azure Backup Service to ensure that all data is consistently backed up, providing resilience against data loss.

5. Data Encryption

- Data is encrypted at rest using industry-standard encryption protocols.

- Even if a hacker manages to access and transfer data, they cannot decrypt it without the appropriate encryption keys, ensuring the confidentiality and integrity of your data.
